We thank God for what He has been doing through Project Redemption.

Anne and I are in several weeks of meetings in the US sharing the spiritual need in French speaking Europe and Africa. Rachel Gostlin is at the International Board of Jewish Missions helping with the French language course. As in times past, she is preparing the meals and helping the missionary/students to practice what they are learning in order to maximize the impact of their training.

Emmanuel Bile and I had a wonderful time of ministry together in Southern Cameroon last month. Thanks to a gift from a church in France, several of the Bile family's personal needs have been met and their children are enrolled in school for the coming year. A young man named Nataly, who has already started a prayer group in Sangmelima has agreed to be mentored by Emmanuel for the coming year. We traveled to Sangmelima to meet with some of the people in the prayer group, preach the gospel to them, and share with them our plans to plant a church and develop a training center in their village. This was well received and the prospects are very good that they will form a core group for the new church plant. Please pray for these promising 'expansions' to our team. Satan will seek to destroy what God is doing, so everyone involved needs much prayer for wisdom, strength, and safety. Emmanuel is in need of \$200 a month in new support to enable him to keep up with the growing ministry.

I traveled to the border of Gabon to meet with Damien Owona and try to enter Gabon in order to see the work in Minvoul. While recent changes to immigration policies prevented me from entering the country, we are thankful for all that we learned about how to proceed in the future and for God's protection during a fairly complicated voyage alone. Damien and I conferred in a town near the border and I spoke with several members of the church by phone. It was a disappointment not to be able to see them face to face but we are all encouraged about what God is doing among them. We are looking forward to continuing the construction on the training center building to provide a better place for the growing church to meet and to base the training programs. About \$4600 is needed to get the center under roof and ready for use.
