I recently received an email saying that the Kitchen/Dining floor has been approved! God has been good and we've been allowed to use the kitchen in the past but no one other than the kitchen staff were allowed inside. Having this space will make such a difference in possible activities and we praise God for His goodness to us, please continue to pray for the approval on the rest of the building. There are 5 floors total and the Knickerbockers are optimistic that in the next couple of years we'll be able to use them to house counselors and children as well as have our own meeting room for chapel services. We are all very thankful for the use of ten chalets, the town meeting hall and the soccer field in the meantime, God has truly touched the hearts of the people in this small town to open the doors to us and accept us into the community.

I'll be flying back to France next month for the camp season. Please be praying with me for the workers, counselors, directors and children coming from all corners of France and beyond. There is still much to do to prepare for their arrival and I can't wait to get there and get my hands into the mix! If anyone in your church is interested in a Summer mission trip in Europe and they are ready to work for the Lord, I would be more than happy to put them in contact with Tim and Elisabeth Knickerbocker to talk about the possibility of spending time with us at Camp Arc-en-Ciel.
